The past few months have been difficult, but we faced them together. On February 16, 2026, Deb's father, Herbert J. Levinson, passed away at 91, making us orphans. For 25 years, we shared the Gospel with Herb; while we didn't see a transformation, he heard its message, and we are at peace knowing the Lord decides his fate.

Herb was never shy about sharing our vocation with people with whom he was conversing. He was proud of who we were and our accomplishments. He even attended one of Deb's Passover presentations many years ago.

#### **A Note From Deb**

Transitions are inevitable. Time to turn the page. I had an amazing relationship with my dad, and he was a big part of my life since moving to Florida nine years ago. Now that chapter has closed. Yes, I mourn and grieve his passing daily. It's hard—but God. As I prayed through these last difficult days, I didn't wonder about my dad's destiny. I asked the Lord to comfort me and give me the strength to persevere. I asked Him to guide me through the grief stage, and I have entered a new lane of ministry. Grief. One can only understand completely after they lose someone important to them, and that will be me now. I am always looking for new ways to

engage, and the Lord has lowered down (as He always does) a new opportunity. Please pray for me in this transition and for the opportunity to engage in ministry with those who have struggled with grief themselves.

We are currently in Atlanta at The Lausanne Consultation on Jewish Evangelism (LCJE), a gathering of Jewish organizations and congregational leaders who seek to share information and resources and stimulate one another's thinking on theological and missiological issues. We gather and strategize on a global level so that more Jewish people will hear and consider the Good News of Jesus the Messiah.

It was also a special blessing to see and hear our keynote speaker, Lon Solomon, who pastored McLean Bible church, the church we attended for 17 years while living in Maryland.

This is the first work trip that I have been able to attend in five months. It is good for my soul to be with my people and to get back to my first love after losing one of the precious loves in my family. I am excited to join the conversations and network with my colleagues, and I am grateful to you who, through your prayers and giving, allow me to do this work.

When I return to Florida, I look forward to reconnecting with my sphere of influence on a greater level. I have put off many of the Jewish immersion opportunities in my community to be by my dad's side for these last five months. I have been praying that the Lord will direct my steps with joy.

I will say that the two Bible studies I have been leading over the years have put pep in my step every week and were a great distraction during dad's illness. The time of preparing and sharing drew me close to the Lord daily. Please pray for the ladies who attend. I am grateful they show up every week and desire to diligently study the Scriptures with me.

Please pray for Deb's brother, Dave, who lived with their dad for the last 9 years. Dave is not a believer and is experiencing a great emptiness in Herb's absence. Pray he will look to the Holy One to fill that void.
